A BIRTHDAY SURPRISE IN SO MANY WAYS....

Your scribe reports...

Back on the 28th December, members of the Playhouse Theatre Trust and the Wurlitzer Organ Trust of Auckland were on hand at the Playhouse Theatre for a special "airing" of our Wurlitzer pipe organ, or rather just a very small part of it.

Coinciding with this, was organist John Hardicker's 92nd birthday, which featured a huge surprise for him – a visit by his dear friend Sydney Organist Margaret Hall, who has played for us back at the Hollywood Cinema numerous times, and had flown to Auckland as a birthday surprise for John. With local friend Doug Farr, and Margaret's husband Alan, they went to the Sky Tower revolving restaurant for lunch first, then came on to the Playhouse - another surprise for John.



Neil Warrington and I loaded John's piston settings into the combination action system together with Margaret Hall's. On arrival the at Playhouse, John jumped on the console, and with the push of a couple of pistons, the most gorgeous sounds were tumbling out of the organ chambers from the 7 ranks playing so far. A little raw with tremulants a light in their bit "throbbing", but none the less the organ was singing.

Margaret and I went upstairs to the balcony and were amazed at how the sound of those 7 ranks filled the theatre - a very "warm" sound, not as hard as it

was in the Hollywood. As Margaret noted, once the reeds go in, the regulators weighted and trems throbbing properly, it will be a formidable sound in this theatre.

Then Margaret had a go, (as pictured above) and she really coaxed some life out of the old girl, with some great show selections. Playhouse Theatre Trust representatives were very much impressed!! It was truly an inspiring afternoon - particularly for me, and has gone a long way to reigniting my passion for the now Playhouse Wurlitzer.

Thank you to Richard & Peter in Adelaide, and Neil with John Swales and their team of helpers, for, bit by bit, bringing this lovely old box of whistles back to life.

Oh - I didn't mention the new Main Blower Motor recently purchased and now installed, giving us our much-needed 18 inches of wind pressure.

NEIL WARRINGTON OUR ORGAN CURATOR REPORTS.....

As I write this, it is early June and our current position sees us with all of the pipe work operational. We have cyphers and faults to repair including dead notes and one short circuit. There appears to be approximately 20 to 30 issues that we need to resolve. Richard has given the organ its first tune and the organ is now in a playable state, but certainly not ready for any concert.

When able, John Swales and I will spend a day at the theatre working through the fault list, but currently, the theatre is very heavily booked, and access is quite challenging.

During the unpacking of the pipes from storage, we found four pipes that were broken and of the four broken pipes, three are very small but the fourth is the bottom note of the 8ft Tromba rank. Happy to report that all these damaged pipes have now been repaired by a Mike Young, a technician from the South Island Organ Company. Mike was in Auckland on a three-month rotation from home-base in Timaru and he was able to repair our pipes in WOTA Trustee Raewyn Reade's garage in Mount Albert.

We are noting that there is a lot of heat in the blower room, which appears to be coming from the wind trunking rather than from the blower or motor. We are yet to run the organ with the air conditioning running in the theatre, which may help. Failing that, we will need to put air conditioning into the blower room. This is just something to bear in mind for the future.

Work to be completed currently revolves around the Percussions. We have wind lines extending to the Percussion Chamber and to the area out above the crossover in the theatre. Here we will have the unenclosed percussions – xylophone, roll & crash cymbals. This will be our next area of focus

Sadly, Peter Hosking's wife is quite unwell, but we are hoping that he will be able to be with us in July. Richard is unable to come at this stage due to his work commitments, so while Peter is here, we will get things started in the Percussion Chamber.

We had planned to install the cabling for the Wurlitzer piano and the plug connection on the left-hand side of the stage, but there is no access under the floor. So, it seems our only option is to run the cable and plugs on the console side. The piano itself needs to be stored in the wings, at the rear of the theatre stage and on concert days, be wheeled out and then plugged in to the organ relay, once it is in position.

I have also booked the theatre for another working bee in early September, when we hope to have both Richard and Peter from Adelaide with us, for a 10-day work program which will hopefully complete the Percussion Chamber.

It is with some sadness that we advise that Margaret Massey is having to sell her Allen Digital Theatre Organ as leg issues now prevent her from playing the organ.

Allen TH-300 compact three manual Theatre Organ. 3 x 61 note manuals and 32 note AGO pedal board.

Absolutely in mint condition. As new with everything working as it should. This very organ was played by UK organist Chris Powell when this model was first released in New Zealand a few years ago and since then has only had one very careful lady owner.


This instrument previously retailed in New Zealand for \$60,000 in 2012 when

released. The organ has too many features to list, but needless to say, includes bench and accessories. This organ has dual voicing (both theatre and classical organ). In addition to the many viewable tabs and controls, it also has two pull out drawers with more controls and touch screen to further enhance your playing experience (including a full transposer, sequencer and voice control).

Although this organ has a very large specification, it was designed so could be transported easily and fit in both large and smaller dwellings. The pedal board is easily detachable. The organ comes with all user manuals, including a special registration guide by USA organist Walt Strony.



This wonderful organ is presently located in Devonport. Auckland with easy access. Margaret has help to assist/supervise with transportation and protective packaging from this end. **Contact Margaret Massey - 09 446-1260**
