"HOLLYWOOD" WURLITZER PIPE ORGAN NEEDS NEW HOME August 30th Final Performance in Avondale

On Saturday afternoon June 20, the Trust was advised by Hollywood Manager Mark Matheson, that he was reluctantly having to end his association with the Hollywood Cinema, ending a fifty year family connection which dates back to his late uncle Jan Grefstad getting a job there as a projectionist in 1964.

The letter went on to confirm that the cinema was to be sold and that the Wurlitzer organ is required to be removed by September 30. Mark had intimated his plans to put the cinema on the market back in April, and it was hoped that the Trust might be able to negotiate a tenancy with the new owner. However, the sale by tender is for "land and buildings" only – not a going-concern.

Faced with this distressing news, the Trust had to quickly decide whether to make Chris & Rosanne's June 21st show our last, giving us plenty of time to carefully disassemble the organ, *OR...* to ensure all our loyal supporters were given opportunity to join us in one last musical treat, before we faced the heart-breaking job of removing the over one thousand pipes, the percussions, wind trunking and kilometres of wiring all in just 30 days!! We chose the latter. We are yet to find suitable storage for the organ and all its components, yet alone a new home.

Our historic Wurlitzer pipe organ from Auckland's Regent Theatre, then the Hutt Valley High School was purchased by an Auckland enthusiast in 1978 and brought back to Auckland, where the late Jan Grefstad, manager of the Hollywood Cinema, welcomed the opportunity to provide a home for the organ, having it installed across the stage of the cinema, right behind the motion picture screen. The Wurlitzer Organ Trust was formed in 1993 to take on the care and ownership of the organ.

The task of moving such an immense instrument is monumental, and hopes of a saviour taking the Hollywood Cinema on as a performing arts centre are fading. With just on 400 seats, it is perfect for small groups, not to mention the 200-300+ loyal supporters who regularly attend the Wurlitzer shows featuring the organ alongside bands, piano, singers and of course doing what it was originally created for – accompanying silent movies.

It is hoped either a school hall or church, which might be looking for a pipe organ, might be prepared to welcome the Wurlitzer Organ Trust and their Mighty Wurlitzer and provide a good home. The organ has a big following and has become an important part of the Australia and New Zealand concert tour circuit by the world's leading entertainers in this musical art form. They regard the "Hollywood Wurlitzer" as a showcase instrument and a heap of fun to play as well as to listen too. The organ has brought so much pleasure to so many people of all ages, we cannot let it end here!

I will miss the unequalled hospitality of your theatre staff, the trust members and your fabulously warm audiences over the years.

I feel for you all, especially being given such short notice and having concert commitments through to the end of the year! With Jelani's concert scheduled for August 30, it worries me that you and the team will have an enormous task removing and storing the Wurlitzer in the time available. Finding a new venue will not be easy, but knowing the determination of the Trust, I know we will once again hear the instrument in a new worthy venue.

I am also so grateful that I limited my mishaps at the Hollywood to tripping over backstage and avoided any swan dives from the console lift! However, let's look forward to a new exciting installation, with or without hazards! I'll be there with knobs on!


