
ANOTHER NEW YEAR!

Ninety years ago in February of 1927, Aucklanders were about to be treated to one of the latest wonders of the cinema experience, when Auckland's Regent Theatre in Queen Street, was to premier its brand new Wurlitzer pipe organ. The first of the larger Wurlitzer organs to come to New Zealand, the Regent Theatre's 2 manual 8 rank Model F "Unit Orchestra" was to breathe life into the silent movies of the day, and see the Regent Theatre's orchestra reduced to playing only on special occasions. The organ was shipped from Wurlitzer's New York factory in October of 1926 arriving in Auckland in December, just missing the official opening of this grand picture palace. However, Aucklanders only had to wait until February 1927 before they finally got to experience the mighty Wurlitzer pipe organ in full cry!

90 years later, we have to wait just a little bit longer before we get to hear this very same organ, singing her heart out once again, this time in her new home at the Playhouse Theatre in Glen Eden.

So until later this year when we hope to have the organ playing, we will continue to provide some events to keep you all entertained. Some of these events will be slightly left of centre, such as our coming *Club Afternoon* on *Sunday March 19* @ 2pm at the Playhouse Theatre.

Well, we did say something a little bit different...this will be a fascinating look at the story behind Auckland's much loved electric trams – "Always A Tram In Sight".

As most of you know, your scribe has a distinct liking of things from a by-gone age, such as Wurlitzer organs and electric street transport, namely trams and trolleybuses. So this subject matter fits the profile!



This presentation was created for another group last year and we thought you might also enjoy this trip down memory lane.

"Always A tram In Sight" will be told through a selection of historic images from the early and often quite stormy years of the trams and will conclude with a ten minute video, taking us through the declining years – these are the years that many of you will remember. Those of you who were with us back in 2008 will have seen this video which we screened as part of a Heritage Festival show with U.K. organist Len Rawle at the Wurlitzer organ. Len provided a "live" musical accompaniment to the video and we have since married the audio recording with the video footage to make for a stunning picture and sound tribute to the last years of the trams.

So although we are delving into a different subject matter, our Wurlitzer organ, although in storage, still has a part to play in this fun afternoon and we do hope you'll join us – remember too, although the event is not open to the public, you are very welcome to bring your friends along.

PLAYHOUSE THEATRE UPDATE

Not a great deal of news to report, however the Playhouse Project architect and FOTW member Graham Upton, has been flat-out working up to Christmas finalising the consent application to the City Council.

Just prior to Christmas, together with Graham and representatives of the *Waitakere Playhouse Theatre Trust*, your scribe as Chairman of WOTA, attended a preliminary meeting with the Auckland Council Heritage Team to ascertain if there would be any "heritage issues" raised by them, as regards the Playhouse Theatre building and the proposals for the back of the theatre, when our formal application is put before Council. Thankfully they had no issues at all and were quite interested in the fact that two "heritage" items would be amalgamated when the Wurlitzer organ chambers are built and the organ installed.

Within the next week or so the formal Resource Consent will be lodged with Auckland Council and fingers-crossed, there will be no concerns or issues raised with the proposal.

Following consent being granted, the fun really starts. Construction quotes sort, funds raised, building commences........ oh it all looks so easy on paper but as you all will know, it never quite works out that way. The WPTT are as keen as we are to get the organ in and playing as soon as possible and they seem confident that the year will end with the sounds of the Wurlitzer rolling forth at the Playhouse!



IT'S THAT TIME OF YEAR AGAIN!

Yes my friends, it is subscription renewal time once again, and despite the fact that our Wurlitzer organ is still not up and playing, it is our fervent hope that you will stay with us and together, we can see these dark days over when the organ once again rises up to thrill us all, with its sweet and powerful sounds of music!
