2015 SEASON TICKET

With the on-going popularity of our Season Tickets, we are once again providing this option alongside our standard *Friends of the Wurlitzer* \$20.00 yearly subscription.

At \$146.00 per person, the **2015 Season Ticket** will cover;

- Membership of the Friends of the Wurlitzer
- Admission to our FOTW Club Doo and afternoon tea on March 8
- Your chosen seat at ALL our Wurlitzer shows for the year

If you wish, you can pay for your Season Ticket at the Club Afternoon, but for catering reasons we will need to know if you are attending, so please phone Jan Nancekivell to advise – see Page 4 for her details.

From the attached seating plan on the flip-side of the membership renewal form, simply choose your favourite seat numbers and these will be secured for you, for all this year's shows. Whether you attend a concert or not, those seats will always be kept for you, so should you be unable to attend a certain show, we encourage you to lend the ticket to your friends as they are most welcome to use your seats. BUT they MUST present the Season Ticket to the ushers on the day. The ticket must ALWAYS be presented to our ushers at each and every show to claim the seats.

On the enclosed seating plan, our existing Season Ticket holders have their seats marked off which they have first right of refusal to renew. 2014 holders, your ticket has now expired, please ensure you renew to keep your seats.

Please note well:

Season Tickets are only available until March 8 – after that date sales are closed off until the following year. All un-renewed 2014 Season Ticket seats will also be released for general availability after that date.

LOOKING BACK AT 2014

For your interest, we reproduce the more "newsy" items from the Annual Report of the Chairman of the Wurlitzer Organ Trust of Auckland

The Shows:

2014 was another very successful year of music and entertainment with the Wurlitzer organ. Our usual program of seven shows was enhanced with the addition of a third silent movie show, to benefit the Hollywood Cinema, this in a bid to aid the cinema manager with the huge costs of keeping the venue going and the dramatic increase in Council rates for the building. Our average audience numbers attending shows have dropped slightly from 239.5 in 2013 to 225.89 this year. The Trust contributed just over \$18k to the Cinema, this returned from silent movie proceeds together with the other associated costs incurred with the organ being housed at the Hollywood. However it is good to note that a small but very pleasing profit on the year was returned.

Once again this year, our application to the ASB Community Trust for funding support for the five "Pops Concert" shows was accepted, seeing WOTA awarded \$10k. This funding was for the following essential operating costs;

- Organ Tuning
- Venue Hire
- Occupation of the stage by the organ chambers and associated hardware
- Advertising/Promotion

Total applied for was \$11,787.50.



Promotion

Once again I uploaded information and promotion for our shows to the *Eventfinda* website with us receiving hits up in the thousands for all shows. It proves that although all website viewers of the event did not actually attend the show, we do have a presence and people are aware of our work. All the main media sources such as the NZ Herald feed from *Eventfinda* and populate their own "What's On" columns from info on this site.

I also continue to maintain the Trust's website and keep show information updated. Our promotion is boosted by the small number of printed posters, circulated by some Trustees and FOTW members to libraries and music shops, together with a shared ad with the cinema placed in the NZ Herald promoting each show over two weekends prior.

With our numbers down on previous years, I feel we must revisit the option of a radio advertising campaign on a station such as "Coast 104.5 FM". Their recent quote was \$2500 per show, and perhaps the Trust could consider running two in 2015. Funding should be sought for this however.

Organ Works

Two big projects were completed this year with assistance from Scott Harrison from Melbourne, together with our own team of Neil Warrington and Graham McBain, with Mat Mathew overseeing. The Crawford Family assisted at one session too.

April:

- Issues with the Kinura rank and ongoing ciphers – temp fix
- Standardising Stop Tab nomenclature to Wurlitzer standard tab colours

During the stop-tab changeover, a major short-circuit took out some I.C. units on the Combination Action this was rectified and the units replaced.

November:

- ➤ Full Stop note check which identified various small faults these fixed
- Work on the Kinura rank started in April now completed
- The Roll & Crash Cymbals now switched independently giving the organist the "Roll" on a toe-stud and the "Crash" on a key-cheek button.
- Digital voices balanced and regulated in volume
- Clarinet rank with speech issues was corrected.

Hollywood Cinema

The year saw on-going discussions regarding the form of the silent movie shows in 2015 because of the imminent retirement of House Organist and Trustee Ron Clark. To honour the organ's need to financially contribute to the survival of its very home, the silent movie shows must continue.

Without Ron Clark's services, it is sensible to utilise the skills of some of our visiting artists, already in town to perform a "pops" show on the Sunday. With them being at a loose end on the Saturday, it was thought that a silent movie show could be staged on that Saturday afternoon at a special fee, taking into account that the silent movies are fund-raisers. With the Trust already having budgeted for the airfare out of the concert proceeds, it leaves the movie show proceeds only having to cover the artist fee and advertising.

This format would mean that two shows are actually grouped together and if the original requirement of three silent movie shows per year, was to be adhered to, it would mean a very unbalanced schedule for shows and would see our team of volunteer house staff having to give up three entire weekends, which the Trust considered was asking too much.

Hollywood Manager Mark Matheson was very open to discuss the situation and understood the Trust's position. Consequently, we now only need to deliver TWO silent movie shows in 2015, with these being back-to-back with two concerts — one in April the other in October.

This will enable a better spread of concert dates through the year and only ties the team up for two full weekends.

General

➤ Jan Nancekivell, continues to look after the critical roles of Concert Ticket Secretary and Membership Secretary for the Friends of the Wurlitzer. Jan does not wish to take on the added responsibility of being a Trustee, instead fills these roles in an honorary capacity for which the Trust is tangibly grateful.

➤ Because of work commitments and some minor health issues, John Kleingeld (pictured below) had to step back from looking after the Thursday Open Console Sessions. WOTA Trustee Neil Warrington has kindly assumed this role and has a small but regular team of players taking part.



At the start of the year, Founding Trustee of WOTA, Ron Clark, advised the Trust of his desire to retire from the Trust and his role as House Organist.




While always sad to lose such a valued member of the team, the Trust understood Ron's wish to take a back seat from 2015 on, and at his final Silent Movie show in October to an almost capacity house, a small was made to presentation Ron acknowledge all his years as House Organist and the extraordinary work he has done in managing the fund raising campaigns for the various stages of the ten year refurbishment program, not to mention the initial fund raising to enable WOTA to purchase the organ in 1993.

SATURDAY APRIL 25 (ANZAC DAY) at 2pm -

WINGS 1927 Silent Movie"

To open our year, we are bringing Melbourne's John Atwell over to present our small tribute to the on-going commemorations of the 100th anniversary of the start of the First World War.

We have had many fun afternoons of music with John Atwell over the years as he has performed alongside an Auckland based 1920s Dance Band, piano, trumpet and vocalist.... Now a new dimension as John accompanies a great classic from the silent movie era, "Wings" made in 1927 and regarded as one of the last great classics from the silent movie era.

See and hear how the Wurlitzer organ brings the silent movie to life through the power of music!!

SUNDAY APRIL 26 at 2pm - "The Music that Got Us Through the War Years!"

John Atwell returns to the console, this time to share some of the most well-known music ever written.

The program features music from some of the darkest days in our history.... The First World War, World War 2, the Korean War of the 50s and the Vietnam War of the 60s. Each period saw music written and songs sung that will ever remain in the public mind and will always be associated with that particular theatre of war.

Most of this music turns out to be some of the liveliest and happiest music ever written, again all designed to lift our spirits and give us the strength to soldier on!!

Join us for an afternoon of fun music at this, our tribute to the music from the war years.

SUNDAY JUNE 21, at 2pm — Chris McPhee & Rosanne Hosking (AUS)

Over recent years, Adelaide's Chris McPhee has also given us some great music at the Hollywood Cinema. As one of the younger generation of Australian theatre organists, Chris enjoys the opportunity to work with other talented artists and for this trip, he is joined by Rosanne Hosking also from Adelaide.

With over 20 years' experience in the entertainment industry, Rosanne's genuine love and passion for singing and performance shines through in everything she does. Possessing a natural warmth and an endearing quality, she is able to connect with audiences and students, young and old.

Chris and Rosanne have performed several shows together with theatre organ in Australia, and for our show, which they've titled "**All Stops Out**", Rosanne will demonstrate her great vocal skills as Chris accompanies her on the Wurlitzer pipe organ. It will definitely be a "Pops" program that includes some of the hits of Edith Piaf, some Light Opera, the great Burt Bacharach, Andrew Lloyd Webber and much more......

SUNDAY AUGUST 30 at 2pm — Jelani Eddington (USA)

Now a real thrill as we welcome back to the Hollywood, one of the USA's younger generation theatre organists.

Jelani is a true consummate musician and over the years, he has become a much-loved entertainer to Auckland audiences, since his first visit in 1996 at the age of twenty-two.

Definitely a program that will feature music for all tastes, from the classics, movie & TV themes, the 20s & 30s, and right on up to today – "Pops on Pipes" this certainly is! A great afternoon indeed is in store with this very popular international touring artist.

SATURDAY OCTOBER 3 at 2pm THE PHANTOM OF THE OPERA 1925 Silent Movie"

Another "great" from the silent movie era, and for this screening, the USA's Dave Wickerham will be at the console of the Hollywood Wurlitzer to use all the organ's resources to bring the silent screen to life.

Currently enjoying a resurgence of interest, this 1925 silent horror classic, stars Lon Chaney, Sr. in the title role of the deformed Phantom who haunts the Paris Opera House, causing murder and mayhem in an attempt to make the woman he loves a star. The movie remains most famous for Chaney's ghastly, self-devised make-up, which was kept a studio secret until the film's premiere.

SUNDAY OCTOBER 4 at 2pm

Dave Wickerham (USA)

In a complete change of pace from the drama of the silent movie, Dave Wickerham will share some lively toe-tapping music with us in another true "Pops" style program.

Who could forget Dave's last visit back in 2012, when he invited his audience to note down their favourite requests during the interval, and then featured almost every item requested during the second half! This proving the amazing virtuosity of this great keyboard entertainer


The audience yelled for MORE! So in answer to that call, here he is!


